On May 16, the first and second grade went on a field trip to The Riverfront in Salem. They stopped by the Salem Carousel and visited the A.C. Gilbert Children's Museum. The carousel had many hand carved animals to ride. Each animal had a theme. There were bucking broncos, race horses, and even a giraffe. The AC Gilbert center had many hands on science experiments indoors and a giant play structure outside. Some of the favorite indoor activities were the giant foam building blocks and the wind machine. Outdoors, the students climbed on a giant spider web and careened down a 2 story twisty tube slide that was dark the whole way. We also had a rocket workshop at AC Gilbert. Students built rockets from paper and launched them by jumping on an air pump. After each launch the students redesigned their rocket to try and make it go farther. Some rockets went as far as 50 feet!



They went on to defeat #8 Bonanza 12-7 and #1 Grant Union 5-0, before returning home to defeat #20 Lakeview 2-0 to earn a berth in the state championship game. They went on to defeat defending champion Kennedy 15-6 for the title. Natalie Draeger was named player of the game after going 4-5 at the plate. The Lady Warriors lose two seniors, Joanna Alcantar and Riley Black, from the team.
