


HOCO 2019


North Umpqua Unified Club

Environmental Science

On Tuesday, October 22nd, 13 students from Mr. Emmick's Environmental Science class traveled to Charleston, Oregon. Students went on a campus tour of University of Oregon's Marine Biology Research Station (OIMB) and the Marine Life Center (an aquarium centered around the Oregon coast). Students were able to learn about marine biology in a hands on way and understand the unique opportunities available to study marine biology on the southern Oregon coast. Afterwards, students went to the South Slough Estuary. Students were taken to Hidden Marsh, where scientists explained ongoing research associated with sea level rise and sedimentation rates. The students were invited back to partake in this research and hope to return in the spring of 2020 to do so.

All of whom, started their training Aug 19th with the goal of running cross country for the first time. With no shortage of progression, each athlete continuously improved throughout the season.
